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Introduction

The Dream Heart Foundation (DHEF-UGANDA) is a nonprofit Community based Organization (CBO) working with marginalized and disadvantaged groups. Founded in 2019 and we became fully registered as a CBO by the Masaka City Municipality in 2021 with the purpose of transforming the quality of life in communities and providing greater opportunities for future sustainable socio-economic development. To achieve our means we focus on community development, Education, Healthand Agriculture. As a registered member of the Masaka City NGO Forum (MACINGOF), we are dedicated to transform lives. The dedication of our volunteers, staff members, and partners, we strive to help those in need. We pursue transformation through our thematic programmes, aiming to address the complexities of poverty and deprivation.

We work tirelessly to feed Children, house the Homeless and advocating for accessible education and healthcare. We depend on financial, material and technical assistance for our goals, objectives, activities and programs. We welcome and encourage unity and collective efforts of volunteers, partners and donors to help us make a difference that will change the lives of communities that can be felt by future generations.

Background

The Dream Heart Foundation was created in 2019 by a small group of students at Kampala University who were conducting research of social challenges felt by local communities in Masaka. Key challenges observed included poor community welfare, limited education opportunities for orphans and vulnerable children as well as high unemployment rates amongst young people. Their decision to form an organisation to address these challenges and implement their shared drive and passion was the first step towards achieving community transformation and a brighter future.

We began our operations in a village called Kimaanya A, providing counselling, sanitary pad and school materials to the local community. Since then, the organization has grown, as of 2020 we have welcomed over 30 members and 20 volunteers. We became a registered CBO in 2021. To complete our registration, we underwent an identity shift transforming from the Dream Kings Foundation to the Dream Heart Foundation. We then became a company limited by guarantee (non-profit) in July 2022.

- 4. Girl Child Program (GCP): Empowering women and girls in their health, education and their choices.
- 5. Entrepreneurial and Technical Skilling of Women, Young Mothers and People with Disabilities: Giving disadvantaged communities economic empowerment and providing opportunities for financial self-sufficiency.
- 6. Zero HIV/AIDS: Provide support and opportunities for sufferers, educate communities on health and wellbeing, partner and network with other NGOs on the front-lines of the epidemic.

Previous Activities

A sanitary Pad Campaign

In partnership with AFRIpads, we provided counselling about female reproductive health and distributed sanitary items to women and girls in Kimaanya Kyabakuza and Nyendo Mukungwe within the villages of Ssenyange and Kimaanya. This initiative was highly successful due to the challenges of affording safe menstrual products for low income households. We hope to distribute items and counselling sessions to more women and girls as well as to expand our geographical reach to alleviate instances of menstrual poverty.

• Entrepreneurship training in Greater Masaka

We worked directly with 10 groups of attendees composed of single mothers, HIV/AIDS sufferers, and disabled peoples in rural Masaka. We aim to empower vulnerable groups economically in providing them an opportunity to select a trade that has the potential to fund their livelihoods. Comprehensive training includes but not limited to: small scale agricultural skills, handicrafts, baking and cooking. In parallel, we also provide lessons on leadership, marketing and sales. We hope to expand our initiative in further diversifying the training we offer.

Community Clean-ups

In Partnership with Ocean Mimic, Indonesia, we have hosted multiple community cleans-up events in Masaka, Nyendo and Kimaanya in order to promote environmental sustainability and community. These initiatives have always been successful and we have managed to collect over 10 tons worth of waste. We aim to build community pride and attentiveness for local ecosystems. We aim to expand our partnerships and volunteer engagements to host more clean-ups in more locations in the region.



Distribution of learning materials in Lwengo district

The DHEF-UGANDA distributed scholastic materials in January 2022 to under privileged children in Lwengo district in Greater Masaka. These include notebooks, stationary, textbooks and interactive activities. We hope to host more distribution activities to enhance the personal development and literacy levels of local children and adolescents for them to have the support they need to reach their full potential.
